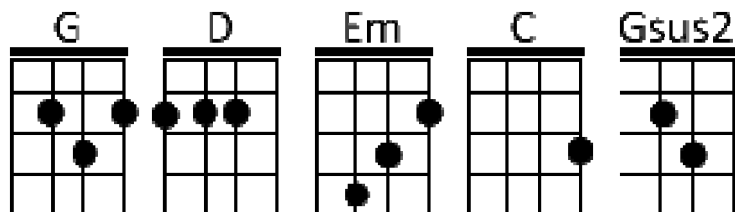


Wagon Wheel - Old Crow Medicine Show
